THE OPIOID CRAVING BRAIN: UTILIZING ADOLESCENT NEUROPSYCHOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT AND PSYCHOLOGICAL-BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTION APPROACHES FOR IMPROVED TREATMENT OUTCOMES

Aim: Adolescents are being diagnosed on daily basis with substance use disorder involving opioid. This presentation will explore the impact of Opioid addiction from a brain-based perspective and propose various neuropsychological assessment and psychological-behavioral approaches from a school neuropsychological perspective. Substance use involving Opioid addiction is a very complex, multifaceted, dynamic problem that cannot be explained by any single neuropsychological factor. This presentation will explore the broad range of neuropsychological issues involving addiction, focusing on various neuropsychological assessment approaches including, but not limited to, learning and memory. Evidence-based practices will be examined with regards to on-going interventions to promote home school/school/life adjustment and achievement. A case study will be reviewed throughout the presentation.

Objective: Explore the impact of opioid addiction on adolescent neurobiological brain development; understand the neuropsychological effects and consequences of substance use on the adolescent opioid addicted brain utilizing a school neuropsychological assessment model; Review the various psychological-behavioral interventions focusing on treatment outcomes and evidence-based practices involving home, school and community as an outgrowth of the neuropsychological assessment profile.

Result: As a result of addressing the above objectives, professionals will learn a "Best practices" approach for treating adolescent opioid addiction.

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AUTONOMY AND CONTROL FACTORS IN PSYCHIATRIC CARE IN JAPAN

ooking inside the walls of private mental institutions in Japan, this paper explores bioethical concerns for autonomy in a high context culture, amongst people diagnosed with severe mental illness. The objective is to identify contextual components of control in Japanese clinical ethics that affect well-being, including the controversial extended use of bed restraints and to discuss culture-specific values in accommodating respect for autonomy. This paper explores cultural normative ethics of hospital conduct and psychiatric health care in situational context. Central to the paper is exploration of respect for autonomy and what this means for a population of people whose voice is seldom heard, always questioned and who are vulnerable to being second-guessed and abused. This paper calls into focus the roles that socio-cultural constructs, history, politics and cultural values play in a health care system for people with psychosis and aims to contribute inquiry into a global social justice within a culture-bound domain of morals and ethics.

While working with Merakey, he had multiple roles, beginning as a Therapist and now in his current position as Executive Director–Addiction Services. He was recently a recipient of Philadelphia's Social Innovation Awards for his work implementing a mobile team to help clean up Philadelphia's encampment sites. He is very passionate and dedicated to help any individual who is seeking treatment through Merakey. He received his Master's in Clinical Counseling Psychology and is a Licensed Professional Counselor in the State of Pennsylvania.

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AN INNOVATIVE APPROACH TO MEDICATED ASSISTED TREATMENT

Merakey Parkside Recovery has designed an innovative treatment model to address the opioid epidemic plaguing the city of Philadelphia. The Merakey Parkside Mobile Intake and Assessment team travel throughout the city, providing outreach, screening and intervention efforts to individuals experiencing substance use and/or co-occurring symptoms. They also deliver interventions through emergency services or admission to the appropriate level of care by creating immediate access to services and engaging individuals in their environment with consideration for their unique needs. The design of this innovative service aims to remove barriers to immediate access to treatment, promote same day admissions, reduce readmissions, shorten lengths of stay and decrease treatment failure, ultimately enhancing treatment outcomes and yielding reduced overall costs. The Merakey Parkside Mobile Intake and Assessment Unit provide access to care utilizing all three forms of MAT (Methadone, Buprenorphine and Vivitrol). Persons in recovery (PIR) have same day access to our physicians so that their physical discomfort in withdrawal can be alleviated as soon as possible. The Mobile Intake and Assessment Unit allows them to continue with their long-standing practice and ability to admit clients to MAT regardless of the use of other substances, issues with transportation, homelessness or any other social determinants of health. Merakey Parkside has improved access to services with the use of our Mobile Unit to actively engage individuals in need of services. The Mobile Unit utilizes a centralized intake hotline for those either in need of recovery services or those who are referring someone to their care. Whether under a bridge in a local encampment site, in a homeless shelter or in a crisis unit the Mobile Unit is truly meeting people at their current living situation. The Merakey Parkside model is based on a true outreach initiative that extends beyond the walls of a traditional clinic and is built on an integrated and coordinated approach to care.
